#### Section 6. Attendance.

All Board of Director Representatives must attend meetings of the Board. If attendance is not possible, that Representative must ensure that a replacement attends the meeting to ensure that the chapter is represented.

- A. If a chapter misses two (2) consecutive meetings in a calendar year, all the members of the offending chapter will be notified of the absence by the most efficient means available, such as email, texting or calling, or by regular mail after the second absence. Chapters that continue to be absent will be listed in the State newsletter, without additional letters being sent to chapter members.
- B. Chapters must attend at least three meetings per calendar year. Chapters not attending at least three meetings per calendar year will face a charter review.

#### **By-Law Change Proposal:**

ARTICLE 6 – POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE (PACs)

#### Section 1. Formation.

Unless barred by law, the Board of Directors may vote to create political action committees (PACs) to further the legislative principles of the corporation.

#### Section 2. State Political Action Committee.

The State political action committee shall be called ABATE PAC and shall consist of not less than a Chairman and Treasurer appointed by the Board of Directors. The State Legislative Coordinator shall act as a consultant to ABATE PAC.

#### Change to read as follows:

Section 2. State Political Action Committee.

The State political action committee shall be called ABATE PAC and shall consist of not less than a Chairman and Treasurer. The trustees of the committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors and select the committee Chairman and Treasurer. The State Legislative Coordinator shall act as a consultant to ABATE PAC.

#### Section 3. Federal Political Action Committee.

The Federal political action committee shall be called A.B.A.T.E. of IL FEDPAC. A.B.A.T.E. OF IL FEDPAC shall consist of not less than a chairman, treasurer and a trustee appointed by the Board of Directors. The State Legislative Coordinator shall act as a consultant to the FEDPAC.

#### Change to read as follows:

Section 3. Federal Political Action Committee.

The Federal action committee shall be called A.B.A.T.E. of IL FEDPAC and shall consist of not less than a Chairman and Treasurer. The trustees of the committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors and select the committee Chairman and Treasurer. The State Legislative Coordinator shall act as a consultant to the FEDPAC.

#### Section 4. Responsibilities.

Chairmen and Treasurers of the respective PACs shall be responsible for any and all reports required by state or federal agencies. Copies of reports shall be sent to the State Office.

Chairman of the respective of the respective PACs shall ensure that either a written or oral report is submitted at each Board of Directors meeting, or any special meeting of the Board of Directors or Executive Board.

#### Change to read as follows:

The Treasurer of the respective PAC shall ensure that either a written or oral report is submitted at each Board of Directors meeting, or at any special meeting of the Board of Directors.

#### Section 5. Positions.

The position of the chairman, treasurer or trustee shall be for a term of two (2) years. Members seeking appointment to either PAC shall submit their letter of intent to the Executive Board for review. The Executive Board shall make its recommendation to the Board of Directors. PAC positions are not automatically officers of the Corporation or members of the Executive or Board of Directors. Officers of the Corporation may hold a position on a PAC, except for the State Legislative Coordinator.

Trustees of the FEDPAC may have an alternate trustee enabled to vote in the absence of the appointed trustee. A quorum may consist of no more than two (2) alternate trustees.

#### Change to read as follows:

The position of trustee shall be for a term of two (2) years. West Region trustees will be appointed in odd years, and East Region trustees will be appointed in even years.

Members seeking appointment to either PAC shall submit their letter of intent to the respective PAC committee chairman for review by the committee.

The respective PAC committee shall make a recommendation to the Board of Directors on the appointment of anyone who submitted a letter of intent.

PAC trustees are not automatically officers of the corporation or members of the Executive or Board of Directors. Officers of the Corporation may hold a position on a PAC, except for the State Legislative Coordinator.

#### **Rational for Proposal:**

This proposal is being made to ensure the PACs are able to vet the needs of the PAC when a new letter of intent is sent in and to vet the candidate to ensure they understand the duties they will be task to perform.

This proposal maintains that the Board of Directors appoints the trustees, but it allows the committees to choose their own chairman and treasurer.

Public Relations Hello ABATE of Illinois!

What great weather we've had for riding! It may be March, but getting to put miles on the way we did in February was incredible. One of the downsides to this is that we're already at 3 motorcyclist fatalities in 2024. It is BEYOND important to be out in your communities letting them know that we are on the roads and to watch for motorcycles.

We're a month away from two big events for ABATE of Illinois. On April 17<sup>th</sup> it's ABATE of Illinois Legislative Day. We'll kick the day off at 8:30am at Floyd's Thirst Parlor in Springfield holding a meeting with Ski going over the day's plans. 



### POTHOLES.... WORSE THAN ASSHOLES.

It's pothole season, again. We've covered this a lot but given the gravity of potholes

with respect to motorcycles, it's worth it to go over it again. The best thing you can do to make the road safer for everyone is to report bad potholes whenever you see them, ideally, before you or someone else hits them and damages a bike, tire, or worse, is injured. If you see a particularly bad pothole, if it's safe for you to do so, you should pull over and take pictures of it. Even better if you have a measuring tape to report the size and depth of the pothole in the picture. When you report all of this information and evidence to the responsible governmental entity, it puts them on notice to fix it. And when you include information and pictures as to the size, it puts them on notice as to the degree of the hazard, making the worse potholes more urgent to fix.

The ideal situation is to report bad potholes prior to an accident or injury, which requires early and consistent reporting of the pothole to authorities. However, we all know these don't always get fixed after being reported, but in the unfortunate situation where there is an accident due to a pothole, this information is still good to have for purposes of pursuing recovery against the responsible entity.

Several years ago, we handled a horrible situation involving a pothole. The potholes were so deep and plentiful on a particular stretch of I-70 that the impact bent the frame of the motorcycle. The motorcyclist did everything right, but due to the bent frame, there was no way for him to regain control of the motorcycle resulting in a fatal accident. It is not too often that people successfully recover against a governmental entity for injuries and damages caused by potholes, but in this situation, we sued the state and won a recovery for his wife and young child. Part of what made our recovery possible was the sheer number of complaints that people had reported regarding this particular stretch of I-70.

There was also the fellow motorcyclist who met our client at a rest stop prior to the accident, they decided to ride together, and so the fellow motorcyclist was riding on the inside of the lane just a little in front of our client when he went down. Since this motorcyclist was riding in front of our client, he didn't know about the accident until he saw it on the news later. He then decided to write an unsolicited letter to our client's widow right after the accident telling her that while he did not see the accident, that her husband was riding right behind him, was going

the speed limit, was doing everything right, and he wanted to make sure that she knew that they were riding together, so her husband was not alone. This fellow motorcyclist's account of their speed was also important in this case as it helped prove our client was truly doing everything right, following the speed limit, and riding safely.

So, when you report a pothole, it matters. These reports help make our roads safer and provide justice to those impacted by unsafe road conditions. -by ABATE LEGAL - Attorney Hilary Barnes

# WHY DID ABATE START ITS OWN LEGAL SERVICE PROGRAM?

A. As we all know, the ABATE Legal Services Plan was established to provide its members access to lawyers who are experienced in motorcycle-related rights and well-regarded in the legal community. The cornerstone of this plan is to provide Members with a discounted rate on most contingency fee cases and better services. Many lawyers are charging at least 33 1/3% with a proviso that the fee could increase to 40%, and with an appeal up to 50%. ABATE stopped all of that to assist its members. It is another value to membership in ABATE.

Some members have gone to non-ABATE lawyers who charge more than the current ABATE plan allows. In the past, our members have seen an ad in other ABATE publications and assume they are getting the best rate and good ABATE lawyers - wrong. Those lawyers almost always charge more. That fact, along with lawyer lien rights, played a prominent role to the disadvantage of an ABATE member who lost her leg in a motorcycle accident. Remember, lawyers belong to the best union in the country (it is called the supreme court) and their fees are well protected. This ABATE member had mistakenly hired the "other lawyers" and then quickly fired them when she discovered she had been misled by an ad in a local ABATE publication. She then hired ABATE lawyers (who finalized her case), but her previous non-ABATE lawyers claimed a lien [even though they did little work] on the settlement proceeds. The end result was the real ABATE lawyers waived their fee, but the other lawyer had to be sued to get his fee reduced.

That ad cost her a lot of money [thousands of dollars] which should have been in her pocket. She could have used that money for a state of the art prosthesis which would have made a difference in her life.

It is no coincidence that the ABATE organizations which are the best in this country have their own LEGAL SERVICES PROGRAM which are OWNED AND CONTROLLED by that ABATE organization for ABATE MEMBERS and their families. That way, those lawyers are accountable times ten.

# WHY SHOULD I EVER GO THRU MY INSURANCE COMPANY TO REPAIR MY BIKE WHEN THE OTHER SIDE IS AT FAULT?

**Q.** The little old lady with blue hair backs over your motorcycle in a parking lot and causes significant damage. She doesn't know what happened. Here is the question. "Do you turn the claim for repair over to your motorcycle insurance company if you have collision coverage, or do you try to get the lady's insurance company to pay? Good question.

A. Since you are not responsible for the damage – she is – you have some choices if you have collision coverage for your motorcycle. So the first thing is to confirm that you have collision coverage on your bike. If you do, your choice is easy. Turn the claim over to your insurance company. Why, you ask? Since the little old lady caused the damage and it is her fault, some believe that they should make the lady's insurance company pay and leave your insurance company out of it. Wrong. You hired your insurance company to take care of you. Let them.

Here are the advantages of having your insurance company pay, especially during riding season:

- 1. Most of the time your insurance company has an immediate obligation to pay. Otherwise if you turn the claim over to the other insurance company you have to wait for that company to investigate and determine liability. Then that company has to estimate the damage all of which takes time your riding time. And good luck getting the adverse to rent you a motorcycle while yours is getting fixed.
- 2. Your insurance company is on your side and has a duty to treat you more fairly than the other guy's insurance company.
- 3. Your rates will not go up if you go through your insurance company. Some will tell you to the contrary but they are wrong.
- 4. The only disadvantage of going through your insurance company is if you have a deductible, you may have to pay that amount before the body shop will let you have your motorcycle, but you can collect your deductible from the other side.

Some states only require \$10,000 of property damage coverage so if your damage and your insurance coverage is more, definitely go through your company.

1. As said above, you may have to pay the deductible amount to the repair shop before they will let you have your bike, but your insurance company will collect the amount of damage it is owed and your deductible from the lady's insurance company and will send the deductible to you.

You may not be able to collect amounts for the rental of another motorcycle from your insurance company - more about that

later.

I just want to give an update to Ordinance 2023-40 that the Village of Elburn, IL passed on November 20, 2023. This was the ordinance that enforced stricter fines for texting and



driving by making a first offense a \$250 fine, a second offense a \$500 fine, and a third+ offense a \$750 fine. The Kane County Circuit Clerk informed the Elburn Village Board that they could not pass that ordinance because of the Illinois Vehicle Code blocking that ability saying that you can't make fines higher than the state "maximum". The maximum fine from the state for a first offense is \$75 which doesn't scare motorists and doesn't make it worthwhile for Police Departments to enforce. So, unfortunately Illinois strikes again in showing that they don't care about the problem that is texting and driving in Illinois. The Ordinance had to be repealed.

Make sure to join us on March 19<sup>th</sup> for our next DuKane ABATE Monthly Membership Meeting at the West Chicago American Legion Post #300 at 7:30 SHARP. 





Candidates are graded on a scale A+ to F-. Upper case grades are given to incumbents, or previous incumbents, based on their performance.

Lower case grades are based on candidate responses to our survey questions. A survey graded in perfect agreement with A.B.A.T.E. of Illinois legislative issues will receive a grade of "c". Higher grades can be given to a non-incumbent candidate whose actions put them beyond survey responses.

A non-incumbent candidate listed as "NR" (not rated) did not respond to the survey, and there is no known history with A.B.A.T.E. of Illinois.

Endorsed candidates are shown in bold and italics.

**Note:** When the 2024 Illinois Primary Election is over and certified, all ratings given will be reset, and all endorsements become null and void. Candidates on the November 5, 2024 General Election ballot will have the opportunity to once again go through the same grading and endorsement process.
