LEGISLATIVE REPORT By Josh "SKI" Witkowski

Corn Growers Sneak Ethanol Expansion into Omnibus Bill – On Friday June 16th at 1:45pm, House Amendment 2 to Senate Bill 1963 was posted with a committee hearing to happen one

hour later at 2:45pm. This 558-page bill was known as the 'Revenue Omnibus" Bill and contained over two dozen different bills rolled into one plus additional requests from various leaders. Among those requests was a small provision that gives 15% Ethanol fuels a special tax rebate with a sunset date of 2028. The intent is to expand the use of E-15 fuels in gas stations around Illinois, but E-15 fuel is not useable by motorcycles, classic cars, medium & heavy trucks, boats, small engines, etc. ABATE of Illinois found out about the ethanol provision in this bill 15 minutes after it was posted, and we testified in committee against the bill. When the bill was debated on the house floor at 9:30pm, almost all the debate was centered on ABATE's opposition to the Ethanol incentives. Ultimately this bill did pass and is headed to the Governor's Desk. ABATE was the only group who formally opposed the bill. We are being told by our friends at the petroleum council and by the corn growers that this will not lead to significant expansion of E-15, but ABATE will continue to monitor the situation and work to pass legislation that will ensure access to the fuels motorcycles need to keep running.

ABATE Off Road Success- This legislative season, ABATE was able to protect the off-highway vehicle trails grant program money from being taken by a proposed tick disease research project. These funds lead to the development of trails for use by the ATV, SxS, and dirt bike community. If the proposed legislation had passed, the grants would no longer exist. ABATE has also worked with stakeholders on the issues of County highway usage by Off Road vehicles and they will be proposing legislation next year that ABATE will no longer oppose as our concerns have been addressed. The legislation still faces a huge uphill battle at the State House though. ABATE is working with the new IDNR director, Natalie Phelps Finnie to finally get the state-owned off-road park opened in southern Illinois.

ABATE Initiated Bills on the way to the Governor's Desk -

This season, ABATE initiated two bills that were passed by the legislature and now head to the Governor's Desk. HB2582 removes the duplicate testing requirement on motorcyclists under 18. Once this bill takes effect, riders under 18 will only need to take & successfully complete the 20hr MSF class available through IDOT. SB896 legalizes Red LED under glow while braking, and legalizes LED insert turn signals, wrap around signals, and handlebar signals.

ABATE Supported Bills on the way to the Governor's Desk – HB2231 removes special legal protections from UBER and the like that shields them from legal liability. In 2017, an UB-

ER driver turned left in front of 2 young riders in Springfield, killing them. If the driver had been working for any other company, the company would've been held liable, but since it was UBER, they were held blameless. HB2231 removes that protection and puts UBER on the same legal plane as taxi and freight companies. SB2028 updates Driver's Education Material to include best practices to be safe around disabled vehicles and stranded motorists, including motorcycles. HB2131 puts a representative of motorcyclists on a proposed zero traffic fatality study group. HB2431 makes it illegal to video conference while driving.

Bills that ABATE defeated this year – HB1108 would've brought noise monitoring to Lake Shore Drive, which has been shown to be a precursor to automated noise enforcement which targets motorcycles unfairly. HB3238 banned body armor possession including many common motorcycle protective clothing items. HB1634 & SB2050 would've brought California Emissions Standards to Illinois, banning internal combustion engines after 2035, and enacting standards that are hostile to motorcycles and offroad.

Still to come – Summer working groups on Autonomous Vehicles & working with IDOT on issues surrounding the Cycle Rider Safety Training Program.

Speaking of the Cycle Rider Safety Training Program -

The proposed award of the Northern training center grant for 2023 to Ride for Change, Ride for Hope Foundation is under review at this time. The 2024-2026 grant applicants saw ICC drop out of the Central Region, and Harper College was not able to get a legislative solution to the liability issues which caused them to drop out. As it sits right now, 75% of Illinois residents will not have access to these classes in 2024. ABATE is working on a solution to this problem, so please stay tuned.

Finally – Changes to how the legislature operates, along with new ethics laws, and how ABATE has been supporting its events at the Capitol is going to lead to discussions about how we move forward into 2024. Please make sure your BOD Representative pays close attention to the legislative report as it will have information to be discussed at your next chapter meetings. I look forward to seeing you all at the ABATE State Party in Petersburg later this month.

SOUTH EAST REGIONAL COORDINATOR REPORT: BOB STOUT

By the time you get this you've probable ridden your motorcycle a few times already this year. I know I have, just not as much as I'd like. I'd like to tell everyone about some success we had earlier this year. In early April there usually isn't a lot going on with motorcycle related events but one of the first event's in this area is a ride to Moonshine Illinois and we planned to set up the State raffle bikes outside there and sell tickets on two consecutive weekends. In the past we have done OK (not great but OK) selling tickets at this location.

Unfortunately, this year the first weekend we planned to set up was the weekend a tornado outbreak passed through the area it did a lot of damage. The damage wasn't at Moonshine itself but it wasn't that far away. Because of the weather we ended up not setting up there that weekend.

Fortunately, since we knew the bikes and trailer were going to be in the area we had contacted a local American Legion and on Monday they let us set up a display by their front door to sell the tickets. Monday was the day they held their weekly "Queen of Hearts Drawing". A "Queen of Hearts Drawing" is a gambling promotion held by the local veterans' clubs' as a fundraiser and in some instances they can raise a good bit of money doing it. It also draws in people who like to gamble. As the pot gets bigger the number of people who attend the drawing also grows. We had gotten their early enough set up near the front door and sales weren't too bad.

The next day was Queen of Hearts Drawing day at the local VFW. They also let us set up in their parking lot (ABATE has a good relationship with local veteran's organizations). Their drawing had been won recently so their prize pot wasn't that big but we still sold some more tickets there.

While we were selling tickets at the American legion, the Commander from an American Legion in a neighboring town invited us to set up and sell tickets at their weekly "Queen of Hearts Drawing" on Wednesday so... We set up at their club too. It was cold and windy that day so they allowed us to set at a table inside (we left the prizes on display outside). They had a really good turnout out and we were able to set a bunch of tickets that day.

The next weekend we did set up in Moonshine Indiana and while the weather was a little cool there were some people there and we sold even more tickets there. When we returned the Bike raffle trailer to Howard Nation, we had sold well over double the number of tickets we thought we were going to sell.

JUST BECAUSE THE OTHER GUY IS AT FAULT IS NO REASON TO TURN YOUR CLAIM OVER TO HIS INSURANCE COMPANY - HERE IS WHY

Hugh Harvey, long time member and mover- shaker of Freedom Valley Chapter in Illinois just called with a problem in that he has been acting as a claims adjuster - urged on by his insurance company to go after the other guy's insurance company no less. You know; calling and getting estimates, debating the amount of repairs to his vehicle etc, fault, rental car, etc. He has been dealing with the adverse insurance company, Allstate who is putting him through the ringer with requests. He obtained the repair estimates and chose the cheap one to save the insurance company money, but that did not count. Insurance guys are tough. Their goal is not to pay you one penny more than required. It is not a fair fight with an insurance company adjuster unless you have that experience. Hugh says they have a list of items they want him to do. Do you know what I said to Hugh? "STOP". And immediately turn this over to YOUR insurance company as that is what you hired them to do. Afterall they are experienced in settling claims and you are not.

Hugh had full coverage with Farmers. That did not do him much good as the adjuster told him to send his claim to the other side and handle the claim on his own - wrong. Hugh has a contract (they call it an insurance policy) with Farmers that says they will do that work and resolve the claim. They will be the adjuster and resolve the claim with an experienced trained adjuster. After all, they have a right to collect the amount they pay Hugh from AllState - the adverse insurance company. That right is called subrogation.

Hugh paid good money to his insurer to avoid turning himself into an adjuster with no experience and sent to do battle with the adverse experienced adjuster. I am surprised that his insurance company allowed that to happen as they are a good insurance company and normally would not expose an insured like Hugh to the devices and experience of an adverse adjuster. I realize many companies are shorthanded but that is no excuse for not doing what they have agreed to do with their insureds like Hugh and that is evaluate his loss and pay him - now! And provide a rental car that he can get into! Then, they can go after the bad guys where it will be a fair fight - experienced adjuster vs. experienced adjuster. That is what Hugh paid for when he bought his insurance policy - nothing less.

INSTRUCTOR RICHARD OVERBEY AND SPECIAL NOTICES REQUIRED BY GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

Richard Overbey, long time and well known instructor at our

Evansville site called regarding an improperly marked curve in Gibson County. That improperly marked curve caused Richard to miss the turn, trashing his bike and himself. Fortunately, he is ok now but still irritated that the county maintenance crew did not follow road protocol in marking the curve properly. Good thing because Richard's claim is lost because of timing and lack of a special notice to the governmental entities involved. Here is the problem and the reason Richard wanted me to write about this issue so this does not happen to you.

Some states have special notice requirements before you can make a negligence claim for losses caused by a governmental entity - meaning the state, county, city, town etc. SO BEWARE. My advice is that if you have such a case, call us immediately after the incident. The notices can be tricky and if some of the information required is missing the "entities" can deny your claim. The one I dislike the most is the requirement of mailing. In some states you can't simply drop your notice in the mailbox. It has to be sent special or does not count. See a summary below, but check with us before you rely on any such dates as they are subject to change anytime the legislature is in session. And remember that a session is a dangerous time for us mere citizens and as Mark Twain asserted, "when congress is in session, no American is safe."

Here is a summary for you.

STATE OF INDIANA - TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY DAYS (270)

CITIES AND TOWNS IN INDIANA - ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS (180)

STATE OF ILLINOIS - ONE YEAR (365 DAYS)

CITIES AND TOWNS - ONE YEAR (365 DAYS)

PAY ATTENTION TO YOUR HEALTHCARE CLAIMS

We often assume these big corporate health insurance companies have refined processes that manage our claims consistently and correctly every time. But here's the thing: they're not perfect and they don't always get it right. When health insurance companies get it wrong, it can result in a big bill being sent to you when it should've been paid by them. The last thing we all need is to have to spend time policing our own health insurance, but unfortunately, that is exactly what we should do to ensure these companies keep their promises.

My experience is that once I hit my deductible, claims processed after that point seem more likely to be labeled "out-of-network" even when the provider and facility were actually in-network, or labeled "not medically necessary" when it was medically necessary.

I've even had the experience of a covered in-network claim being applied to coinsurance after I'd already hit my in-network out-of-pocket maximum, yet my in-network out-of-pocket claims calculator failed to include this claim anywhere in my claims calculation. This resulted in a \$2,400+ medical bill being sent to me when it should have been 100% covered by insurance.

The first person I spoke with at the insurance company did not understand the issue. I called again, and the second person I spoke with understood exactly what I was talking about, so if you don't succeed the first time, try again with a different person. It took several calls and emails, several different people, and about a 60-day time period, but my health insurance acknowledged their mistake and paid the bill.

Moral of the story: big corporate companies make mistakes so you should check their work.

MOTORCYCLE NATION

Q. Was the first land race at the Indy 500 with motorcycles? ABATE MEMBER

A. The year 1909 was a time when there were no cars, generally speaking. Just trains, horses, bicycles and most significantly motorcycles. For a biker that meant almost nothing to watch out for other than people, horses and maybe a mule or two. It was August of that year and a guy by the name of Fisher (famous as founder of the Indianapolis 500, Miami Beach and Presto-Lite) was holding the first race at the Indy 500; it was a motorcycle race. William Harley and Walter Davidson were there along with their chief line foreman, and everybody that was anybody in motorcycling.

How do I know this? While at the Indy Motorcycle Expo, I took in the Old Timers area. There, the old flat trackers, hill climbers, and Daytona veterans were in force. Some bring artifacts from the glory days, like Kenny Staughton. For the last several decades the equivalent of the painting of the signing of the Declaration of Independence to motorcyclists has hung above Kenny's living room couch. It is one of those seven-foot-long - one-foot-high brown-toned photographs of old. The photograph looks North on Indy's Meridian Street from the base of Monument Circle (The past site of the Motorcycles on Meridian). Positioned on about a third of the Circle are 250 motorcycles. I can identify two cylinder Indians and one cylinder Harleys. In those days Harley was not into speed, but endurance as gas was expensive and hard to get - no gas stations. The Indian was into speed, so two races were to happen. One was the speed race at the Indy 500 and the other was an endurance race starting in Cleveland, down to Columbus, over to Dayton, then to Richmond, passing just below Sky Castle Airport, through Rushville and finally to Indy. Bill Harley and Walter Davidson won the endurance race and came together with the Indy racers for the photograph. I can identify William Harley and Walter Davidson and the Harley Davidson factory foreman - I think. Or at least that is my story and I'm sticking to it. Thought about having a contest and naming it "Where's Walter" after the kid game.

What is striking about the photo is there are no cars in the

photo - well maybe a lonely handmade Buick, but that is about it. Around the sea of motorcycles are horse and carriages and a bicycle or two. In 1909 we were truly a motorcycle nation. Not till 1912 when Henry Ford implemented the assembly line in Detroit City did that change. Bob Schulteti of Harley South-Side believes that Motorcycle Nation existed into the late teens before there were enough cars to make a difference and cause two wheelers problems.

While admiring Kenny's photograph, I wondered aloud where the motorcyclists got gas, since there were no cars- no gas stations? Bob Schulteti knew the answer - drug stores. Imagine - a land before gas stations and no place to get a Big Gulp.

Kenny allowed us to copy his living room treasure. Next time you are in my office, take the time to gaze at a photograph that captured a time when America was a "motorcycle nation" - with not one gas station.
