Driverless cars are killing bikers – ABATE is planning days of action to bring attention to the issue of driverless cars killing bikers. I first wrote a public piece about this

issue 6 years ago, and it is beyond time to protect our Brothers and Sisters on the road. As of the writing of this article, we don't have confirmed dates for our action. ABATE is looking at late May through June timeframe right now. It's time to get loud ABATE, please check with your chapter legislative coordinators, and email me at legislative@abate-il.org for more information.

ALSO, Legislative Day T-Shirts have been made available as part of a reprint. Get your "My Life is not a Field Test" t-shirts today by heading to www.abate-il.org. Again, VERY SPECIAL THANKS TO KASKASKIA VALLEY ABATE — Their sizeable donation to legislative made the t-shirts possible which made a huge impact on how ABATE was seen at the Capitol. Per BOD motion, re-print shirts are being made available at near cost (\$10 for S-2XL, \$11.50 3XL, \$14 4XL) to encourage their purchase. They should be available for pick up at the June BOD meeting and State Party as well. The last day to Order is Memorial Day, Monday May 29<sup>th</sup>. Please be aware that this is being done through legislative, not the interim products coordinator, so all inquiries about the shirts should be made to legislative@abate-il.org.

BEWARE the Motorcycle Industry Council — As part of our fight on Autonomous vehicles, ABATE introduced HB2053 which would've protected motorcyclists' interests by requiring driverless cars to undergo testing before being released on public roads. Unfortunately, a newer group out of DC called the Motorcycle Industry Council has entered the discussion in Illinois and is trying to position themselves as the authority on motorcyclist concerns on driverless vehicles. The MIC does not represent a single American company, they only represent the interests of manufacturing companies who want public road testing of this technology. ABATE will work to educate lawmakers about this group and why they do not represent motorcyclists in Illinois.

Legislation  $\underline{\text{still active}}$  that ABATE is Supporting:

HB2582 (Passed House, Currently in the Senate) – Removes a duplicative testing requirement on motorcyclists under 18. Riders under 18 would still be required to take the 20hr MSF course, but not required to test again at an SOS facility after having just passed a more rigorous test in the MSF class. SOS

is supporting this measure.

HB2231 (Passed House, Currently in the Senate) – This bill would remove special legal protections from UBER and the like that shields them from legal liability. In 2017, an UBER driver turned left in front of 2 young riders in Springfield, killing them. If the driver had been working for any other company, the company would've been held liable, but since it was UBER, they were held blameless. HB2231 removes that protection and puts UBER on the same legal plane as taxi and freight companies.

SB896 (Passed Senate, Currently in House) – Legalizes Red LED underglow while braking, and legalizes LED insert turn signals, wrap around signals, and handlebar signals. Thanks to the Illinois State Police for helping us draft language on the issue. This bill is being picked up by Rep Hanson & Sanilitro. It will face one Amendment in the house and hopefully pass after that.

**SB2028 (Passed Senate, Currently in House)** – Updates Driver's Education Material to include best practices to be safe around disabled vehicles and stranded motorists, including motorcycles.

UPDATE on Motorcycle Safety Classes – IDOT has awarded the Northern training center grant for 2023 to Ride for Change, Ride for Hope Foundation. ABATE is currently investigating how this decision was reached as this foundation does not appear to have the infrastructure to provide the classes per the terms of the grant. The 2024-2026 grant applications are in review as of the time of this article being published.

Finally, May 6th & 7th Freedom Fest and Freedom Rally; Please join in the festivities at the Freedom Fest and attend the Freedom Rally for a great ride to the Capitol. May is Motorcycle Awareness Month and let's get out there are show who we are! See you all there.





BOD2023- 006 BOD2023- 007	Motion to allow Josh Witkowski to use his vendor to purchase and sell legislative day shirts for ten dollars by Kishwaukee Valley, send by Prairieland. Discussions. Starved Rock opposed. Motion passed.  Motion to follow the By-Law Committees recommendation and not accept the proposed by-law amendment by Freedom Valley, second by Open Roads. Discussions. Blackhawk, Central, Dukane, Embarras Valley, Freebird, Freedom Valley, Kaskaskia Valley, Lamoine Valley, Liberty, Lincolnland, Midstate, Open Roads, Peo-Taz, Richland County, Shoal Creek, State Line Riders, Tri-county and Twin Rivers opposed. Motion failed.
BOD2023- 008	Motion to accept the proposed by-law amendment to the by-laws by Freebird, second by Liberty. With only fourteen chapters voting in favor, the motion failed to meet the two third majority required to pass. Motion failed.
BOD2023- 009	Motion to give all three chapters up for charter review (Pathfinders, State Line Riders and Windy City) a trial for another year by Eastern Illinois, second by Thunder Rock. Discussions. Blackhawk opposed. Motion passed.
BOD2023- 010	Motion to lower the Chapter Liability insurance from one hundred and twenty dollars down to eighty-five dollars effect January 1, 2024 by Eastern Illinois, second by Northern Illinois. Discussions. No opposed. Motion passed.
BOD2023- 011	Motion to accept the Executive Board's recommendation to allow advertising to be lax from the policy and procedure for the 2023 State Party by Thunder Rock, second by Prairieland. No opposed. Motion passed.
BOD2023- 012	Motion to accept the Executive Board's recommendation and appoint Sharilyn Kibler-Russell to the FED/PAC by Eastern Illinois, second by Tri-County. No opposed. Motion passed.





#### SOUTH EAST REGIONAL COORDINATOR REPORT: BOB STOUT

Earlier this year ABATE held our annual "Legislative day" As you should know, this is an event were we (members of ABATE) gather at the state capitol and talk to our state politicians. By

"talking to our politicians" I mean actually standing next to and having a conversation with the person who is representing you. Not writing a letter that is read by some flunky intern who decides it should go in the circular file. You can also ask them questions. For example, I once at a Legislative Day I asked my local representative about his voting record on having ethanol in our gas. I live in a rural area and a LOT of his constituents are corn farmers and his reply was that it was what most of his constituents wanted. His reply wasn't what I wanted to hear but he took the time to listen to my concerns and I cannot fault him for doing what the people who voted him in have asked him to do. By having an intelligent conversation with them you can learn a lot about what they think. Even better is the fact that they get a chance to learn what you think. I was once told "You know what is better than knowing who your state representative is? Having them know who you are."

In the 25+ years I've been a member of ABATE I have only been to a small number legislative days. I understand the reasoning for not going but I believe everyone should make time to go at least once. It helps you understand how our laws are made.

If you have never been to a Legislative day, this is how it went for me this year (There is a lot of preparation beforehand to allow this event to happen but I did not get involved in that) ..... It started by everyone gathering at Floyds Thirst Parlor (A restaurant/bar near the capital and also the location the reception was to be held). We were given special ABATE Legislative day t-shirts to wear and after putting them on we stood around talking with each other for a bit. We were then given instructions what to do and how to do it.

We then all carpooled to the State Capital building and went through the screening process to be allowed inside (It's like going into an airport). Once inside we went to where a table was set up and got a folder for our representatives. They tried to give you the folder for someone whose district you are in but in my case someone else already had them. Since it was my first time in the building I went with someone who was more familiar the way things worked. We picked up the folders for some of the representatives then made our way to their office inside the capital building.

Inside the folder were our "position papers" and a questionnaire. The "position paper" was a couple pieces of paper that told what our position was on various bills being considered. The questionnaire had questions on what the representative thought about general motorcycling issues. We spent all morning going from one representative's office to

another. Since both houses were "in session" nearly all our politicians were in Springfield but this also meant they were busy all day. If they weren't in the main court, they were in committee meetings.

All state representatives have an assigned receptionist. We (Me and the guy I was working with) were not able to talk with any of the representatives in the morning session so were unable to have the questionnaires filled out. But we did find all of their offices (the Capital building is a BIG place) and we talked to their receptionists (I don't know if they qualify as a flunky intern). We had two main jobs. One was to be seen and let everyone know we were there. The other was to get the position papers to the representative and invite them to the reception that evening. Around lunch time we were supposed for a group photo but I missed it because I was still passing out stuff in another part of the building.

After a late lunch I was pretty tired and had some unrelated ABATE issues to deal with so I took a break. Later that afternoon We all started to trickle back into Floyds Thirst Parlor (they were closed to anyone except ABATE members prior to the reception that evening). In the early evening the personnel at Floyds' set up a food buffet (the food was good). Then, the capitol started shutting down for the night and a number of the representatives arrived for the reception. If your local representative came to the reception, this was where you could talk to them. I was lucky and was able to talk to most of the various representatives in my area.

Now, for the reason I put this in my Region report... Josh Witkowski says this years' Legislative day was very successful. But, I noticed one issue. When I looked at the member sign in sheet for the event, there were not very many of us who were there from the Southeast region. I realize that our region doesn't have as many people in it as some regions do and the event is always held on a day where many of us have to work but, it would be nice to get at least one person from each chapter next year.

MIRACLE RIDE COMING—SATURDAY JUNE 3RD!

Every year since 1994, bikers have gathered together to support Riley Hospital for Children. And you can be part of it and help the kids at Riley.

Since its inception, the Miracle Ride has raised just under 7 million dollars for the kids at Riley, and 99 percent of those funds have been raised by volunteers. The Miracle Ride Foundation has just a skeleton staff that is paid for their work. So many thanks to those who volunteer time, dollars, motorcycles and expertise. #### **EVENT INSURANCE**

Q. Asst. Region Director here. We have a few questions regarding ABATE event insurance we are hoping you might be able to assist with. We of course get a COI from the state office for our sanctioned events for the specific day and event location, but what should we be requiring, if anything, from vendors that might set up at our event? Should we be requesting COI's (to CYA) from all vendors? Maybe for only food/alcohol/equipment vendors?

We are looking for the best route that covers ABATE, the officers, the event itself, and of course the participants. However, on the flip side of that we realize that not all vendors might be an established business (such as artsy/crafty vendors) and might not be able to obtain a COI for the event if requested. If you could please provide any information and input on this, we would greatly appreciate it! Thank you.

A. As much as we can reasonably get. Certificates of Insurance should be obtained from all food and alcohol vendors - always and no exceptions. Also included in that compulsory list are those who provide unique services and items for entertainment. As you suspect many of the artsy/crafty vendors may not have insurance, so we are relying on the waiver/release that is required for admission for all attendees to cover us. But we should require an indemnification agreement from the artsy vendors just in case our waiver for attendees is held unenforceable. This means that if that artsy vendor screws up and injures one of our attendees, we have a claim over and against that vendor. Our required Waiver/Release, if enforceable, should get the artsy vendor off the hook along with us as they are generally identified in our waiver. If our waiver is not enforceable for some reason, we can hold that vendor responsible, so we are not paying for his sins.

#### BEHIND ON MY MORTGAGE PAYMENT

**Q:** I am hurting financially. My wife and I have been paying on our home for over 25 years. I do not have the full amount for this month's mortgage payment. What will happen if I stop paying? What are my options? -South Suburban Chapter Member and Region 1 Member

**A:** Call your mortgage company ASAP. When and if you get a live person, get a name, number, and mailing address for that person to confirm all of your questions and their advice to you. Here are your options:

- 1. Determine the amount you can afford to pay now and see if the mortgage company will defer the rest until you have better times. Most banks understand that we are going through hard times and that we are all in this together. Remember the banks are not doing a lot better than we are, but they are getting a bailout— you are not. Most mortgage companies have some sort of mortgage assistance; you may also be able to review those options on your Mortgage Company's website.
- 2. Do nothing. Of course, the mortgage company will foreclose and put you out of your home. Depending on the equity in your home there could be a deficiency judgment. Of course, there will also be attorney's fees, interest and costs awarded against you, as provided in the mortgage. This process could take from 2 to 6 months, but ultimately, they will put you out on the street.
- 3. File bankruptcy if your overall financial situation warrants such a drastic action. This allows you and your family to start over. A fresh start is the right of all Americans and is guaranteed in the Constitution.

Good luck. There but for the grace of God go all of us. If you have any more questions, call me.





#### March 20, 2023, Battle Lines Being Drawn

In August 2022 California Governor Gavin Newsom announced, and the California Air Resources Board (CARB) approved, an executive order requiring sales of all new passenger vehicles be zero-emission by 2035. While the California directive doesn't include motorcycles yet, motorcyclist advocates in the Golden State have warned that motorcycles will be an obvious next target.

Unsurprisingly, other states quickly followed suit and enacted similar policies. Massachusetts, Oregon, Washington, New York, New Jersey, and Maryland have all sought to put similar restrictions in place. In total 17 states have laws that bind their emissions regulations to those of California.

However, leaders in many states, including those that are obliged to follow California's lead, are pushing back. In Colorado, the Energy Office said, "While the governor shares the goal of rapidly moving towards electric vehicles, he is skeptical about requiring 100% of cars sold to be electric by a certain date as technology is rapidly changing."

Virginia governor Glenn Youngkin was even more forceful, "I am already at work to prevent this ridiculous edict from being forced on Virginians. California's out of touch laws have no place in our Commonwealth."

This month the New Hampshire House of Representatives voted down a bill that would have forced New Hampshire to match California's emissions goals.

Congressional Republicans are also joining the fight against the California policies. Last week H.R. 1435 was introduced, titled the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act." H.R. 1435 would amend the Clean Air Act to prevent the elimination of the sale of internal combustion engines, effectively overruling California's move. Within just a week, 66 cosponsors from 26 different states joined in support.

The movement isn't contained to the United States. Last month, the European Parliament formally approved a law to effectively ban the sale of new gas and diesel powered vehicles in the European Union starting in 2035. But Europe, too, is seeing pushback. Farmers in the Netherlands have taken to the streets in protest of emissions regulations. Member nations of the EU are also expressing a desire to make changes to the newly enacted policy. Germany, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Romania, and Slovakia are discussing what changes they'd like to see to the European Union's 2035 plan.

This issue is not new to the MRF. Our 2023 legislative agenda includes this priority: "Work against any efforts by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) that endanger the future of motorcycling."

We are ready for this fight and will work with partners across the country to defend the future of motorcycling and the lifestyle we cherish!


