# Tesla to Expand Use of Biker Killing Technology in Illinois

ABATE of Illinois Calls on Governor & Legislative Leaders to Convene Working Group

TESLA has announced the expansion of testing their experimental full-service autonomous driving technology on public roadways into 14 additional cities including Elgin, Illinois. They announced new positions for drivers to collect data from the use of their autopilot and full-service driving systems. This technology was the subject of a blockbuster Washington Post Report that revealed TESLA's full-service driving & autopilot driving systems have killed more drivers than previously disclosed. This included four motorcyclists, three of whom were run over at highway speeds by TESLA vehicles using these driving modes.

The specific threat posed to bikers by Tesla vehicles was recently recognized by former NHTSA Senior Safety Advisor Missy Cummings who stated, "It's very dangerous for motorcycles to be around Teslas". Missy continues to be active in the autonomous vehicle field as a professor at George Mason University's College of Engineering & Computing.

"Despite the documented dangers to motorcyclists and the driving public, Tesla continues to push forward with the irresponsible and hazardous testing of their vehicles on public roadways." Said Bob Ellinger, State Coordinator of ABATE of Illinois. "ABATE of Illinois has been a leader in talking about the dangers of Tesla vehicles in Illinois and nationwide. We will continue to fight against technology on the road that has shown to be fatal to riders."

In addition to being dangerous to bikers and motorists, Tesla autonomous systems are under investigation for 16 different crashes into first responder vehicles including one fatality. The initial investigation was for 10 collisions, and 6 additional collisions were found during that investigation.

"While Congress removed any reference to Autonomous Vehicles in recently passed Highway Bills, there were several bills filed this year to deal with the responsible regulation of these vehicles here in Illinois." According to Josh Witkowski, State Legislative Coordinator & Lobbyist for ABATE of Illinois. "Our lives are not a field test for autonomous vehicles like Tesla, and Illinois must step up to lead in responsible regulation and development of autonomous technology. There was talk of a serious autonomous vehicles working group during session. Now is the time to make that happen."

A recent AAA study found that only 9% of Americans "trust" self driving vehicles and 68% are "afraid" of it. This is an increase in the level of distrust of autonomous vehicles since the AAA started tracking surveys on the issue. ABATE believes that this increased level of distrust is directly due to increased fatalities caused by Tesla's haphazard deployment of testing their dangerous technologies. This increased distrust is harmful to those companies who want to responsibly develop autonomous technology in Illinois.

Therefore, in an effort to protect the motorcyclists of Illinois and encourage responsible development of autonomous technology in Illinois, ABATE of Illinois is calling on the Governor and legislative leaders to convene an Autonomous Vehicle Working Group to develop legislation that will both protect the public and help keep Illinois a leader in developing the next generation of transportation technologies. This group should have representatives from the manufacturing and industry sectors, transportation safety advocates and professionals, and transportation advocacy groups representing all modes of transportation and road users.







# CAN I GET ANY RELIEF UNDER THE LEMON LAW ACT?

**Q.** I purchased a new 2022 Harley-Davidson CVO Tri Glide last March, I

have had nothing but problems with it ever since . It has been in 3-4 Harley-Davidson Dealerships getting worked on for the same problems and they can't figure out what is wrong with it. It has been back in my local Harley-Davidson dealership since July 19th and they have been working with Milwaukee over the phone trying to find out what is wrong, and they still don't know. I have over \$50k in the bike. Does the Lemon Law Act cover this? Thanks John P. - ABATE of IN Member

A. John, Sorry to say that Indiana does not have a lemon law that applies to motorcycles. My experience is that Harley-Davidson will try its best to make you happy and fix the problem. Harley is reporting it is a wiring harness defect (a wiring harness made overseas). Keep track of your costs as a result of this issue as those costs may be recoverable. Also, confirm every conversation with the Harley rep via email (it doesn't count unless it is in writing) and show a cc to me, that might help. Keep me posted, Rod.

# LITIGATION FUNDING, OR HOW DOES AN INJURED BIKER PAY THE MORTGAGE WHILE THEIR CASE IS PENDING?

Everyone knows that waiting on the case to settle can be financially painful. Injured bikers with a strapped budget have a much harder time riding out the storm until a settlement is reached, sometimes causing them to settle for less than their case is worth. Plaintiffs that have sustained injuries and are now disabled may very well need money to live on during the interim period before they receive their settlement. Moreover, an insurance company, or other wealthy litigant, will probably be in no hurry to settle until they reach an agreement more in their favor, regardless of how long that may take. Regretfully, this is where litigation funding tries to justify its existence.

Litigation funding companies may advance a plaintiff money for living expenses, medical care, or for whatever else the money is needed for a stake in the final settlement. This type of lending is non recourse, meaning that in the case the plaintiff loses, they owe nothing to the funding company. The borrower is only liable for repayment from the settlement money they receive. Of course, this is not all bliss, and should only be used as a LAST RESORT. The interest a client will owe on the advancement can be unreasonable.

These companies decide interest rates and the amount they are willing to advance based on the merits of the case. So the

stronger the case, the better deal the injured biker will receive. The longer the case takes to settle, the higher the effective interest rate, which begs the question, "does this really level the playing field?" Well, maybe in a few cases, but probably not in most. With the litigation funding industry still in adolescent stages, it will be a few more years before we can decide whether or not this is a good thing. In some states, the practice of litigation funding may be illegal. In the meantime, here are a few pointers if this is your only option:

- Talk with your attorney and discuss options before making any decisions
- Exhaust all other means of financing first, as this should be a last resort

# LET'S GO FOR A RIDE AND VISIT SANTA ANNA'S LEG IN SPRINGFIELD - HE ACCIDENTLY INVENTED CHEWING GUM AND THE CUBS

That's right. Santa Anna's leg rests in the Illinois Military Museum in Springfield Illinois. For this ride I am traveling from the East and taking US 36, going past Ernie Pyle's house (the famous WW2) Stars and Stripes news reporter and the world's largest soybean elevator in Decatur.

The end of the trip will be Springfield where I will pay a visit to the artificial leg of Generalissimo Santa Anna. Remember he is the guy that killed Davy Crockett, Jim Bowie and William Travis? After killing Davy C and the boys, Gen. Sam Houston chased Santa Anna to Jacinto. While fleeing he left behind his artificial leg, a chicken dinner and 18k in cash. Some boys from the Illinois 8th Cavalry requisitioned the leg, the cash and ate the chicken. Don't know what happened to the cash (if they were from my home county - Wayne - I can guess - big party), but the leg wound up in the Illinois Military Museum in Springfield. Here is what happened to Santa Anna. Sam Houston and the boys "Remembered the Alamo" - took him prisoner and that is the end of the story - right?

Not so fast. I always wondered what happened to the Generalissimo. Was he killed, captured, imprisoned or what? Guess what? Sam Houston spared his life and then Santa Anna wound up in Long Island New York.

He brought with him chicle which is dried sap from the Sapodilla tree in Mexico. He chewed it to calm his nerves - probably when wondering what Gen. Houston was going to do with him. Did he really invent chewing gum - chiclets? The story goes that an inventor watched Santa chewing the stuff and thought it would be a good rubber substitute. It didn't work. Santa Anna skipped town and left the inventor with the chicle storage bills.

Trying to make something out of nothing, the inventor took the stuff to a druggist who made chewable balls. Then he flavored the stuff with sassafras, licorice (called Black Jack) and the rest is history. After I learned the above, I wondered if Sam Houston had executed Santa, would Wrigley have gone into the gum business and most importantly would he have had enough

money to have bought the Cubs? Seems that a real Cub fan would have a picture of the Generalissimo on his wall. Amazing what you can learn on a ride.

# CAN MY EMPLOYER DO THAT? BIKE SHOP BLUES.

Q. I'm a mechanic in a local bike shop, and my employer recently told me I need to sign an agreement that I won't work for another shop within a ten mile radius if I leave my current job. I don't think that's fair. There are a number of bike shops around here, and almost all of them are within ten miles from my current employer. Can they really enforce that agreement against me?

A. Probably. What they have asked you to sign is called a non-compete agreement. It used to be that non-compete agreements were used only with managers or sales personnel. However, they are becoming more common with service personnel who develop relationships with customers and entice customers to follow them if they move to a new employer. Even though non-compete agreements are not favored by the law, if they follow the rules, those agreements are generally enforceable, provided the employer can show a reasonable belief that a departing employee could create unfair competition. However, non-compete agreements have to be reasonable in their restrictions. They can restrict a person from working in the same field, but only for a reasonable time period or within a reasonable distance from the employer's service area.

If your employer makes it a condition of your employment you may have no choice but to sign the agreement if you want to keep working there. If you sign the agreement and leave the job later, the employer can ask a court to prevent you from working for a competitor. If the court finds that the agreement contains reasonable restrictions, and doesn't unfairly limit your rights to find a new job, the court could enter an order preventing you from working for the competitor and assess damages against you.



and fatalities so far this year. We even invited a member of the Springfield Police Department to come speak to us about how we can curb or even prevent these crashes in the future. It seems we are doing it to ourselves just as much as they are doing it to us. Its time we change the "START SEEING MOTORCY-CLES" slogan. People see it, but it's not as effective as it used to be. I am going to ask for time to speak in front of the BOD in October to discuss my views as a 23+ year member of the organization. I'm not making any claims to be the best membership coordinator nor do I have all the answers to how we can curb or stop crashes.

The consensus from our local Police Department is "WE" as motorcyclists are going to have to go back to the basics of paying more attention to our surroundings as well as prepare to drive more defensively than ever. We also need to make sure our heads are 100% in the game when we straddle the saddle. These days drivers are not thinking motorcycles once behind the wheel. They are more interested in Work, Supper, What to get at the store, When do they need to get their child to their baseball or soccer game. Also in the Springfield area our traffic lights are horribly timed if at all. Very frustrating to be sitting at a red light seeing the next block is currently green, knowing it will turn red before you get to the next light.


Unfortunately, drivers are sick and tired of sitting at traffic lights all too many times. This has force a very dangerous situation where drivers are running red lights saying to themselves "I'll be damned if I sit at yet another red light right now. #### Will the Feds Ever Act on Autonomous Vehicles?

In 2017 and 2018, the House and Senate both attempted to pass legislation regarding the

development and testing of autonomous vehicles (AVS). Those efforts failed to produce legislation,

leaving the Department of Transportation and manufacturers to develop their own guidelines.

For 6 years Congress has failed to act... we hope things are changing! Last week, the Energy and

Commerce Subcommittee on Innovation, Data, and Commerce held a hearing on this new

technology. The hearing was titled: "Self-Driving Vehicle Legislative Framework: Enhancing Safety,

Improving Lives and Mobility, and Beating China."

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) has long advocated for motorcyclists to be included in any

legislation on this topic. We've worked with our champions on Capitol Hill to stress how important it

is for self-driving cars to have the ability to read, react and respond to motorcyclists on the road.

During the hearing, House Motorcycle Caucus Co-Chair, Representative Tim Walberg made a point

of mentioning what he has heard from us.

"Many in the motorcycle community are concerned that the technology is able to detect and protect

motorcyclists on the road. We are very different from pedestri-

ans and bicyclists because we are in and

amongst traffic. It is a concern and I hope that we continue to address it."

As we know, no one is looking out for bikers, except bikers. Representative Walberg is a biker, so he

gets it! Let's keep fighting, educating, and making our priorities known. If we don't do it, who will?

In just two months, members of the MRF will establish our legislative agenda for next year, at the

Meeting of the Minds in Harrisburg, PA. If you're curious what we want in the self-driving car space,

here's what we approved at the 2022 meeting.

2023 MRF Legislative Agenda - Critical Priority:

Advocate and monitor any legislation or regulations related to motorcycles concerning connected and

autonomous vehicles (AV):

Endorse rulemaking to set new standards specific to seeing, detecting, and properly reacting to motorcycles.

② Ensure motorcycles are part of all testing and development procedures.

Promote that any AV public user advisory committees should include a representative from the

motorcycle community and a motorcycle manufacturer.

② Require a public, easily accessible, and searchable database
where consumers can look up

important safety information such as the limitations and capabilities of different products

offered by AV manufacturers or service providers.

Require that all AV manufacturers must submit safety evaluation reports to detail and make

public how their vehicles identify motorcycles among other road users. Manufacturers must

also include human error analysis in safety reports.

Require that all AV manufacturers must publicly report crash data share incidents between AVs

and motorcycles just as they would incidents between AVs and other road users.

Protect the safety of motorcyclists with any rules or standards as it relates to electronic and

cybersecurity systems including the clarification of rights of data ownership of any recorded

data in the context of connected and autonomous vehicles.

Inclusion of motorcyclists' perspectives in discussions regarding the Intelligent Transportation

System (ITS).

 $\ensuremath{\overline{\cancel{2}}}$  Work to ensure motorcycles are a separate classification of vehicle and road user for purposes

of regulation and testing of AVs.

Protect the set aside radio spectrums necessary for DSRC vehicle to vehicle communications.

Protect additional spectrum as needed for Vehicle to Everything technology (V2X).


